### INTRODUCTION

100 Leading Ladies is a photographic project featuring portraits of influential senior women in Britain.

Over the course of two years, award-winning international photographer Nancy Honey endeavoured to photograph 100 of Britain's most respected women over the age of 55; from academics to entrepreneurs, fashion designers to composers. The Leading Ladies all share one thing in common: they are leading figures in their fields and have defied gender stereotypes.

Honey invited each woman to select a place of inspiration for their portrait setting, affording the viewer further insight into the lives, personalities and character of these admirable women.

These captivating portraits are complimented by insightful interviews conducted by former Times journalist Hattie Garlick.

One hundred women, one hundred portraits, one hundred unique stories to inspire and pioneer a vision for women of the future.



### BACKGROUND

'In my own lifetime I have witnessed a profound shift: from little girls imagining their future as marriage and children to the now total belief from childhood that a woman will grow up to have a career outside the home. It is more important than ever to see the important women from all fields in our society and hear their voices of experience.'

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In today's Britain, women in senior management or influential positions over the age of 55 years are invisible. Statistics highlight how few women are in positions of power, from Parliament to the boardroom. The few who do break through this glass ceiling remain largely uncelebrated and unheard of. The 100 Leading Ladies project sought to rectify this.



#### WHO ARE THESE UNSEEN LADIES?

In this project we meet well-known women like Germaine Greer, alongside lesserknown pioneers, like Averil Mansfield, the first female professor of surgery in the UK. The project features politicians, scientists, restaurateurs, CEOs, authors and Britain's oldest working super model. The Leading Ladies are from every walk of life and have taken up influential roles in the running of the country and have impacted British culture.

Their stories chart the myriad ways in which women have wielded influence over the last couple of decades whilst raising important and timely questions about changing attitudes to female leadership.

### WHAT CAN THESE UNSEEN LADIES TEACH US?

Today's young professional women, and the schoolgirls who will take the lead tomorrow, require inspiring role models and access to their wisdom.

100 Leading Ladies aims to provide this access. The project explores in depth the personal and public issues surrounding women's success in the workplace: What would Britain's Leading Ladies tell their younger self? What would they share with young women starting along their road today? How did these influential women manage their jobs, children and families?

The warmth and experience of these women makes this project important for everyone who aspires to follow in their footsteps, and for all who are curious about the road to the top, meeting challenge head on, and being true to one's own destiny.
